**ORDER APPROVING PROCEDURES  
FOR SUPPLEMENTAL KUSE FUNDING**

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission) for a decision. Being fully advised in the premises and familiar with its files and records, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

1.       The Commission opened this docket by an Order dated March 16, 2000, for the purpose of ensuring compliance with its directive to Staff, in Order 6 in Docket No. 00-GIMT-236-GIT, to work with the parties to address procedures for supplemental funding requests, pursuant to K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 66-2008(e). The Commission directed Staff to file a report by May 1, 2000.

2.       On April 28, 2000, Staff filed the Report, which had previously been circulated to the parties to ensure that Staff had accurately reflected the agreement of the parties. Staffs Notice of the Report, with the Report attached was served on the parties. In its Notice, Staff stated that the parties had already reviewed the Report and stated their agreement. Staff, therefore, recommended that the Commission issue an Order adopting the procedure, agreed to in the Report, for supplemental funding requests pursuant to K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 66-2008(e), unless the Commission received comments or protests from the parties within two weeks from

the date of filing and serving the Notice.

3. More than 3 weeks have elapsed since Staffs Notice was filed. The Commission has received no protests or comments on the Notice and Report. The Commission, therefore, finds that the Report and Recommendation on Procedures for Supplemental Funding Requests pursuant to K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 66-2008(e) shall be approved. The Report is attached to this Order as Attachment 1 and the Commission finds that the procedures set out therein shall govern all such future supplemental funding requests. The Commission finds that it is appropriate that supplemental funding requests be posted to the Commission's web site at the time intervals recommended in the Report. Parties may check the Commission's web site around the specified filing dates at <http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/docket/telecom.htm> The separate link, "Quarterly Supplemental Funding Requests," will contain all requests for the particular quarter. One docket shall be opened each quarter to address all supplemental funding requests received for that quarter. In order to ensure that all "affected parties" become aware that they may receive notice of requests for supplemental funding by checking the web site, this Order shall be served on all companies currently contributing to and/or receiving support from the KUSF. Future certification orders shall also incorporate the information contained in the Report.

IT IS, THEREFORE, BY THE COMMISSION ORDERED THAT:

A. The Report and Recommendation on Procedures for Supplemental Funding Requests, pursuant to K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 66-2008(e), is approved.

B. Any party may file a petition for reconsideration of this Order within fifteen (15) days of the date this Order is served. If service is by mail, service is complete upon mailing and three (3) days may be added to the above time frame.

C. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further order or orders as it may deem necessary and proper.



**Staff Report and Recommendation for  
KUSF Supplemental Funding Requests**

**Background**

In its February 14, 2000 Order,<sup>1</sup> the Commission directed Staff to work with CURB and the Industry to develop a process for addressing Kansas Universal Service Fund (KUSF) supplemental funding requests for any purpose stated in K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 66-2008(e). By letter, dated February 21, 2000, Staff requested comments from CURB and the Industry, and scheduled a meeting for March 30, 2000. Comments were submitted by AT&T Communications of the Southwest (AT&T), Birch Telecom (Birch), Citizens' Utility Ratepayer Board (CURB), Southwestern Bell Telephone (SWBT), Sprint Long Distance, Sprint/United, and Sprint PCS (Sprint), and State Independent Alliance (SIA). Comments were compiled and sent to the parties prior to the meeting. Attendees of the March 30, 2000 meeting included: Ms. Rene` Martinez, Mr. Michael Pauls, Ms. Dana Bradbury Green, and Mr. Bob Flappan for AT&T; Ms. Rose Mulvany for Birch; Mr. Mike Lura, and Mr. Brady Cantrell for CURB; Mr. Mark Caplinger, Mr. Chris Barron, Mr. Roger Bales, Mr. Kendall Mikesell, Mr. Don Stowell, and Mr. Greg Reed for SIA; Mr. Tom Gleason for Columbus et. for Sprint; Mr. Todd McGuire for Western Wireless; and Ms. Janette Luehring, Ms. Eva Powers, Ms. Sandy Reams, and Mr. Jerry Lammers for Staff (herein referred to as Parties).

Parties agreed to address only supplemental funding requests for a percentage increase in access lines at the meeting. Procedures for all other purposes listed in K.S.A. 66-2008(e) have been determined in other dockets. All Parties received a draft of this Report and Recommendation and agreed with the procedures set forth. Due to the Parties' cooperation, this Report and Recommendation focuses on a competitively-neutral process for KUSF supplemental funding requests for net increases in supported access lines. This Report addresses the following:

- I. Access line criteria for supplemental funding,
- II. Thresholds for filing supplemental funding requests,
- III. Prior 12-month period on which a net increase will be based and KUSF Annual Updates,
- Iv. Supplemental funding request filing process,
- V. Affected parties, and the review and verification process, and
- VI. Other issues raised by the parties.

### **I. Access Line Criteria for Supplemental Funding**

K.S.A. 66-2008(e) allows any telecommunications carrier, public utility, or wireless provider to request supplemental funding based on a net percentage increase in access lines over the prior 12-months. The Commission recently designated two wireless providers as eligible telecommunications carriers (ETCs)<sup>2</sup>; therefore, the parties developed competitively neutral criteria for access lines qualifying for supplemental funding:

- A. An access line can no longer be defined as the traditional "two copper pair placed

in the ground,” but needs to be more generic to encompass any technology. The Parties agreed that to be technologically neutral, an access line should be defined as *“any revenue producing access line over which universal service is provided and meets the KCC’s definition of a supported line.”*<sup>3</sup>

- B. *Net changes in all residential and single-line business lines should be included for supplemental funding purposes since they are defined as “supported lines” at this time.* If, or when, the Commission implements KUSF support for primary lines only, the parties will revisit the process outlined in this Report and Recommendation to determine if any modifications are necessary.

## **II. Threshold for Filing KUSF Supplemental Funding Requests**

Currently, an incumbent Local Exchange Carrier (LEC) or designated ETC can file a supplemental funding request whenever it experiences any increase in supported access lines. This has often resulted in the National Exchange Carrier Association (NECA), the KUSF Administrator, processing several requests every month. Any time a supplemental funding request is submitted, both the company and NECA incur costs; therefore, the Parties agreed it would be more efficient to have set guidelines for filing requests.

All Parties expressed concerns about a process that would allow both the LECs and new entrants to be treated fairly, without penalizing any party. Various options, such as leaving the current process in place, semi-annual filings, and specific percentage increase thresholds (i.e. 1%, 2%, and 5%), were discussed. Several Parties supported a “waiver provision”, which would allow a party to petition the Commission for supplemental funding if it had a significant increase in access lines, but did not meet the threshold criteria.

For Federal Universal Service Funding (FUSF) purposes, companies file access line updates for quarters ended March 31, June 30, September 30, and December 31. Since companies have recent data as of these quarter-ends, the Parties agreed it would be easier for companies to file KUSF supplemental funding requests on the same quarterly basis. Several Parties continued to state that their companies may not have a significant net increase in access lines at the end of any quarter, but could experience a significant increase in access lines within any quarter. To allow a greater degree of predictability of request filings and the impact on the KUSF, a resolution to forgo implementation of a waiver provision in favor of more frequent filing times and a lower threshold percentage was reached. The resolution allows, but does not require, a company to file for supplemental KUSF when either of the following occurs:

- A. *Quarterly, based on any 12-month net increase in access lines for the months' ended March 31, June 31, Sept. 30, and Dec. 31, or*
- B. *Between quarters if a company experiences a 2% or greater 12-month net increase in access lines. Although this criterion allows a company to file for supplemental funding at any time other than at end of any quarter, the Parties do not foresee these types of filings occurring frequently.*

### **III. Prior 12-Month Period Basis for Determining Increase in Access Lines and Change to KUSF Annual Updates**

Several considerations were given to what prior 12-month period (i.e. a calendar year, KUSF year, a rolling-12 month period, etc.) should be the basis for determination of a net increase. Once the parties agreed supplemental funding requests could be filed quarterly, it became apparent that a rolling prior 12-month period, corresponding to each quarter-end, should be the basis for determining if the company has experienced a net increase of access lines.

Currently, a LEC's next year's KUSF payout distribution is dependent on the number of

supported access lines it has as of October 31. Staff also uses the total access lines a company has as of October 31 to calculate the maximum per line assessment a LEC may flow through to its customers. On a going-forward basis, Staff will also need to calculate an ETC's next year's KUSF based on its total supported access lines. Since the Parties recommend companies be allowed to submit quarterly filings for supplemental funding, they also recommend that total September 30 month-end access line counts be used for the annual update. This allows Staff adequate time to calculate the next year's distributions and assessments without burdening the companies with gathering access line counts as of September 30 for FUSF purposes and as of October 31 for KUSF purposes.

If the Commission adopts the recommendations set forth in this Report, all LECs and ETCs serving in supported areas will need to file their total KUSF supported access lines, for the month-ended September 30, with Staff by November 15. This will allow Staff to calculate each company's KUSF support for the new year. Additionally, all LECs will need to also provide their total company access lines so that Staff can calculate the maximum per line assessment that may be flowed through to customers.

#### **IV. Filing Process**

In addition to the annual update filing, a LEC or ETC may file for supplemental funding based on the quarters-ending March 31, June 30, and December 31. To allow companies adequate time to compile their filing data, yet avoid protracted delays or retroactive filings, a company will submit its quarterly filing within 45 days following the end of a quarter. A schedule for submitting quarterly requests, along with the respective 45-day deadlines is shown in Attachment A to this Report. Any filing, other than a mid-quarter filing based on a 2% net increase, submitted after the 45-day deadline should be denied by the Commission.



All supplemental funding requests will be submitted to the Commission and, by statute, the Commission has 120 days in which to review and approve the application. In Docket No.99-GIMT-326-GIT, the Commission adopted the policy of providing KUSF support for high cost wirecenters in non-rural (SWBT's and Sprint) serving areas. The wirecenters are further broken down into Zone 1 and Zone 2, with each Zone receiving a different amount of KUSF support. Companies providing service in any designated high cost wirecenter must track its supported access lines on a zone by zone basis to determine if it has experienced a net increase in access lines. Although the Rural LECs are not currently receiving KUSF support on a zone by zone basis, Staff and the Rural LECs are working together to develop ,a methodology that could be implemented for those companies<sup>4</sup>. The Parties agreed that supplemental funding request filings should contain comparable information, yet be administratively simple to file, and asked Staff to create new forms to be used in the filings. These forms, shown in Attachments B, C, D, and E, were sent to all Parties and incorporate suggested changes. Any request for supplemental funding will contain the following:

1. Attachment B-filed by any company filing for supplemental KUSF funding support and by all LECs and ETCs during the Annual Update process.
2. Attachment C-filed only by companies providing service in and requesting KUSF support for wirecenters in SWBT's serving area.
3. Attachment D-filed only by companies providing service in and requesting KUSF support for wirecenters in Sprint's serving area.
4. Attachment E-filed only by companies providing service in and requesting KUSF support for wirecenters in any Rural LEC serving areas. Attachment E will allow Staff to easily incorporate any new Zone funding policy implemented in the future.
5. Supporting documentation the company relied on to reach its conclusion that a net increase in access lines occurred.

## V. Affected Parties and the Review & Verification Process

K.S.A. 66-2008(e) provides that all affected parties shall be allowed to review and verify any requests and to intervene in any proceeding addressing the requests. Thus, the Parties needed to define who is an affected party, determine a process for notifying all affected parties while minimizing a company's filing costs, and determine a process for reviewing and verifying submitted requests.

Any supplemental funding request impacts the size of the KUSF, which affects all companies contributing to or receiving disbursements from the KUSF. Therefore, the Parties recommend that an affected party be defined as *any company contributing to or receiving support from the KUSF*.

The notification process would consist of the Commission opening a supplemental funding docket in which to address the current quarter's supplemental requests. Based on the schedule outlined in Attachment A, any interested party would monitor the web site and intervene in the docket if it wished to participate. Based on discussions with KCC Docket Room and Information Resources' personnel, Staff recommends that the Commission open one docket each quarter in which all supplemental funding requests be addressed. This will minimize the number of dockets parties need to track, yet allows a separate docket in which all supplemental funding requests for that quarter are filed.

When a quarterly docket is opened, it will be posted on the Commission's web site at: <http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/docket/telecom.htm>. A separate link, titled 'Quarterly Supplemental Funding Requests,' will contain all supplemental funding requests filed that quarter, along with any pleadings in the docket. The docket will also be listed on the Commission's docket calendar web site.

To avoid unduly delaying a company's supplemental funding request, the review and

verification process should continue to be as simple as possible. After a request is received, Staff, CURB, and NECA will have access to the data. Any affected party may intervene in the proceeding. If the information filed has been designated as proprietary or confidential, the Commission will need to issue a protective order. After signing the protective order, CURB and any interveners could ask Requests For Information (RFIs) to gain information needed to verify the access line increase. Any RFIs need to be narrow in scope so that only data necessary to verify the reported access line increase is requested.

The Parties recommend that the Commission's order regarding this Report and Recommendation for KUSF Supplemental Funding Requests be served on all companies currently contributing to or receiving support from the KUSF. The order should incorporate the Filing Process information as set forth above, along with all Attachments. In addition, future certification orders should also contain this information.

## **VI. Other Issues Raised**

Other issues raised in Parties' comments include:

- a. How, and with what frequency, do carriers report the gain or loss of a customer to or from another carrier?
- b. What does the phrase "supplemental funding from the KUSF shall be used for infrastructure expenditures necessary to serve additional customers within the service area of such qualifying utility, provider, or carrier" mean?
- c. How will competitive carriers use supplemental funding?
- d. What criteria are appropriate for a first time report of access lines by a new ETC?

Although these issues will need to be addressed, everyone agreed this was not the correct forum in which to address them. Most Parties believe that these issues are more appropriately addressed in other dockets, specifically Docket No. 99-GIMT-326-GIT.
